What is Neighbourhood Care?

Neighbourhood Care is a family support service for families with children aged 0-8. The service uses childminders to offer short term, part time support to families.



Neighbourhood carers, as they are known, live in the local community and can provide a wide range of placement options, from day care to overnight and weekend care.

The placements are flexible, time limited and planned and are individually tailored to meet the needs of each family.

Neighbourhood Care recognises that:

- Bringing up children can be one of the hardest jobs you will ever do.
- All families struggle from time to time.
- Families without relatives or friends to help them can become isolated and may find themselves in crisis.
- Childcare can be difficult to find if you are on a low income.
- Sometimes being a parent can be overwhelming.
- Families know what help they need.
- A little bit of help can go a long way.

Neighbourhood Care aims to:

- Support families to enable children to stay at home.
- Give families a breathing space.
- Support the child's health and education needs in the placement.
- Help families to make links in the local community.

How do I become a Neighbourhood Carer?

The Neighbourhood Care Service is currently recruiting carers in this area. If you are a registered childminder, please contact the team for a recruitment pack. The pack will contain an application form, pay rates and more information about the role of neighbourhood carer.

If you are not a childminder but are interested in becoming one, contact the Childcare Information Bureau on 0121-303 3521.

How do I get this service?

The service does not take referrals directly from families. Ask your social worker, health visitor, sure start worker or someone who has that level of involvement with your family to make a referral on your behalf. A referral pack can be obtained from the Neighbourhood Care team at St Luke's.
